

# Take a stroll under The Danforth's natural canopy

Discover the canopy of the Danforth East neighbourhood as Toronto Tree Tours and the Danforth East Community Association host an outing.

The tour takes place Sunday, May 25 from 2 to 4 p.m. Arborist Todd Irvine and local activist Mary Margaret McMahon lead the tour. Participants can admire the massive canopies of the historic white and red oaks that are prominent in the area, as well as discover other interesting native species as they meander through the streets.

Those on the tour can also learn about the challenges facing the urban forest and how local tree planting and conservation initiatives are reinvigorating the neighbourhood.
