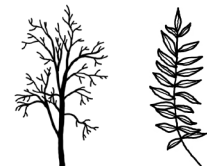

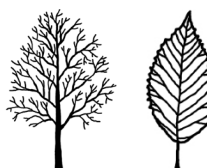

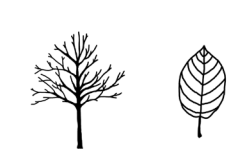

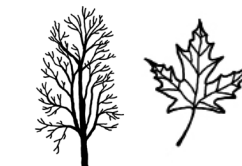

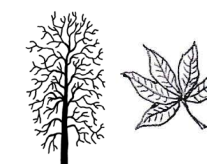

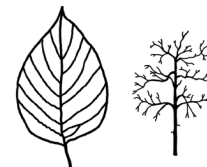

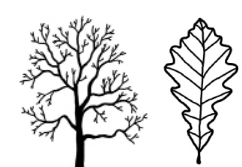

- **assess** the soil and light conditions of your property
- **ensure** your tree has enough room to grow both above and below ground
- **recommend** planting locations and native species that will thrive
- **do** the hard work of digging and planting (unless you plant yourself with the DIY option)
- **share** ongoing tree care information for long-term success

Full Service Tree Planting Program

From \$160 to \$230 (species dependent) for:

Do-It-Yourself Tree Planting Program

From \$110 to \$180 (species dependent) for:

- online educational videos
- 30 minute virtual consultation with an arborist
- 5-8’ tall native deciduous tree (2-4’ tall native evergreen tree)
- delivery (property owner plants)
- mulch and planting/care guide

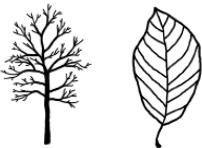

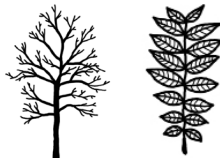

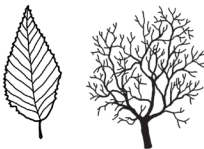
