

LEAF

simple, darker green above and paler green below, waxy, elliptical with serrate edges; emerge in spring

FALL COLOUR

brilliant shades of yellow to orange to red

BARK

smooth, light grey when young; smoothly grooved with muscle-like longitudinal ridges, slate grey when mature

FLOWER

small, yellowish-green, non-showy, clusters of male catkins and small, yellowish-green, fuzzy clusters of female catkins; emerge in mid to late spring

FRUIT

tiny, green to brown, leafy, winged nutlets suspended in clusters; mature in late summer/early fall and disperse in winter
