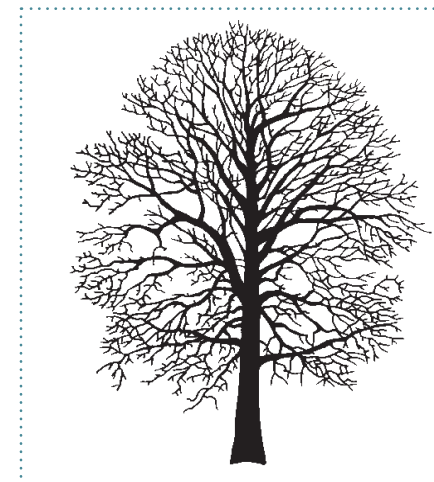

FORM

HEIGHT 50 feet
WIDTH 35 feet

broad, rounded crown with open, spreading branches

LEAF

simple, dark green above and pale, fuzzy green below, irregular rounded lobes with two deep lobes in the middle nearly dividing the leaf in half; emerge in spring

FALL COLOUR

yellow to bronze

BARK

light grey-brown when young; rough, furrowed, corky twigs, dark grey-brown when mature

FLOWER

small, yellowish-green, slender, drooping male catkins and single, greenish-red, short female spikes; emerge in spring just after the leaves

FRUIT

large, green to brown, oval acorns with fringed, furry caps; mature in late summer/early fall
