HEIGHT 40 feet
WIDTH 15 feet
 dense, pyramidal crown with a strongly tapered trunk

LEAF

single, dark green above and paler whitish-green below, short, flat, blunt evergreen needles arranged in two opposite rows

FALL COLOUR

none (evergreen)

BARK

smooth, grey-brown when young; thick, scaly, furrowed, reddish-brown to grey-brown when mature

CONES

small, yellow, round, non-showy male and light green, oval female clusters found near ends of branches; females mature to dry, light brown cones with rounded scales that hang on slender stalks; emerge in spring, mature in fall and persist throughout the winter
