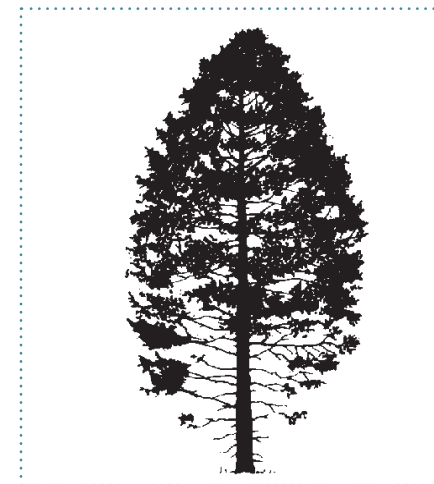

FORM

HEIGHT 20 feet
WIDTH 7 feet

dense, conical to narrowly pyramidal crown that can be single or multi-stemmed

LEAF

evergreen, yellowish-green, flat, scale-like, fan-shaped sprays; new foliage emerges in spring

FALL COLOUR

none (evergreen); although sometimes turns a bronze colour in the fall

BARK

reddish brown when young; fibrous, exfoliating, red-brown to grey when mature

CONES

female fruits mature to small, brown, oblong cones borne upright on branches with reddish-brown, leathery, rounded scales; emerge in spring, mature throughout the winter

NEW CONES

small, yellowish, round male and dry, pinkish female clusters found at branch tips
