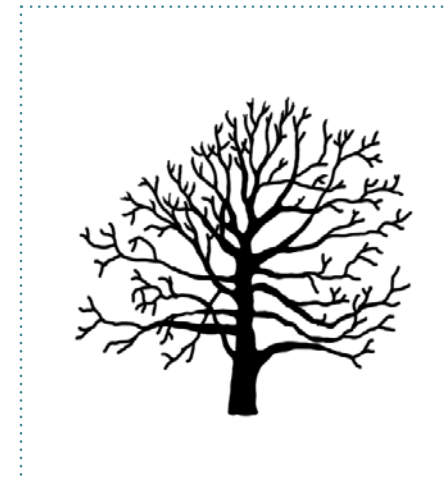

FORM

HEIGHT 15 feet
WIDTH 15 feet

oval to rounded crown with upright branches; may spread if root suckers are not removed

LEAF

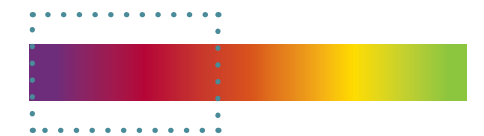
simple, dark green above and paler green below, ovate to elliptical with smooth edges; emerge in spring

FALL COLOUR

shades of red to purple

BARK

smooth, light ash grey when young; thinly plated, grey with reddish-orange undertones when mature

FLOWER

small, creamy white, attractive, flat-topped clusters; emerge in early summer

FRUIT

small, white, clusters of drupes containing 1-2 seeds and borne on red stems (that often persist into the winter); mature in late summer/early fall
