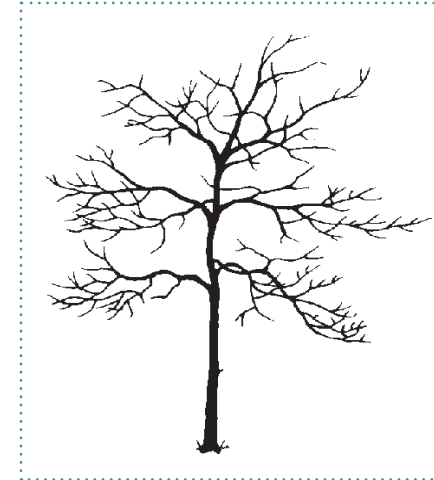
MATURE FORM

FORM

HEIGHT 15 feet
WIDTH 15 feet

open, irregular, layered crown that grows in a unique twisted/whirl pattern; may spread if root suckers are not removed



LEAF

simple but clustered near branch tips, dark green above and paler green below, ovate with smooth edges; emerge in spring



FALL COLOUR

red to purple



BARK

smooth, streaky, greenish-brown to red when young; rigid, fissured, grey-brown when mature



FLOWER

small, white, fragrant, flat-topped clusters; appear in late spring



FRUIT

small, green to bluish-black, round clusters of berries containing small seeds and borne on pinkish-red stems (that often persist into the winter); mature in late summer/early fall
