**HEIGHT** 40 feet  
**WIDTH** 15 feet

## LEAVES

single, bluish-green, short, often sharp, square in cross-section, pointed evergreen needles

## FALL COLOUR

none (evergreen)

## BARK

smooth, grey-brown when young; scaly, flaky, dark grey when mature

## CONES

small, reddish-yellow male and small, purple female clusters that hang near branch tips; females mature to small, light brown, oval, papery, woody cones with rounded, flexible scales; emerge in late spring, mature in late summer, persist throughout fall and winter
